<u>ICDP – International Child Development Programme</u>, was developed by Professor Karsten Hundeid and Professor Henning Rye at the University of Oslo in the 1990s.

ICDP's founding principles are rooted in the International Convention on Human Rights and the Convention on the Rights of the Child.

The programme is based on a humanistic tradition in which empathic understanding of children and young people is an important element.

In 2018, the programme was in use in 43 countries.

In Norway, the Directorate for Children, Youth and Family Affairs (Bufetat) is responsible for making the programme available in all Norwegian municipalities. Training and monitoring of group leaders is delegated to Bufetat's Parent Support National Competence Centre.
